

Garden Art Causing Traffic Jams

One particular piece of outdoor art being displayed at this year's Street has caused an interesting and fun 'traffic jam' with our show patrons.

Located at the entrance to "**Tamarack**" (House # 4), is Oregon artist **Steve Reinmuth's** stunning "**Soniquarious Fountain**". As each bronze chalice bell gradually fills up with water, it begins a progressive 'ringing of the bells', ultimately ending with the grand finale as each of the five bells sounds off after tipping it's water to the next bell. The beautiful sounds can be heard throughout the Street.

According to Show Director Irma Sikma, *"Everyone wants to wait to see and hear the final cycle, so the lines to the house begin at the sculpture. It's so fun."* Each cycle takes about 7 minutes.
